

## **Purdue North Central Dual Credit/Concurrent Enrollment Program**

### **What is Dual Credit/Concurrent Enrollment?**

Dual Credit/Concurrent Enrollment is an opportunity for students to receive college credit through a university by taking courses that are approved and offered at the high school, during the regular school day, taught by qualified high school teachers. Students use the books provided by the high school, and the teachers follow very similar curriculum, assignments and testing as their college faculty counterparts.

### **What are the benefits of Dual Credit/Concurrent Enrollment?**

To Parents:

- Improved student opportunity for success in college
- Familiarity with university registration process
- Financial Advantages
  - Reduced tuition cost - \$93.45 per credit hour for the 2009/2010 academic year
  - Free/Reduced lunch students - 100% tuition assistance
  - No additional fees - no books, activity, lab, technology, or transportation fees

- Satisfies requirements for the Academic Honors Diploma
- Jump start on credit hours – credits are posted to a Purdue Transcript
- Builds confidence for college success
