Instructions for applying to Purdue North Central

- Type or print clearly your full, legal name in ink
- A transcript evaluation fee of \$30 must be submitted by all applicants transferring from another university
- Missing or incorrect items will delay processing of your application
- If you have been academically dismissed from any Purdue campus contact PNC Enrollment Services for readmissions instructions and deadlines.

No Previous College Work

- First-time Freshman** - If you have never attended a college, submit this application and an official high-school transcript or GED scores. If you graduated from high school less than three year ago, submit SAT I or ACT scores.
- Non-Degree** - If you are planning to take a few courses for credit, but do not intend to pursue a degree, submit this application. Non-degree students may apply no more than 18 semester hours of work towards an undergraduate degree at a Purdue campus. Non-degree students are not eligible for financial aid.
- International Student** - If you are a citizen of another country, you will submit this application along with an equivalent document to the U.S. high school transcript which has been translated into English, the Supplemental Undergraduate Application form, financial documentation, an adequate TOEFL score, proof of health insurance, and \$30 application fee.

Some Previous College Work

- Transfer** - If you have attended college, but never attended PNC or another Purdue campus, submit this application, an official high school transcript or GED scores and official transcripts from **all colleges you have attended**. If you hold a bachelor's degree, you do not need to submit a high school transcript. There is a one time \$30 transcript evaluation fee on transcripts outside of the Purdue system.
- International Transfer Student** - If you have attended college in the U.S. or abroad, but have never attended college at a Purdue campus, submit this application along with an equivalent document to the U.S. high school transcript, college transcripts (translated into English), the Supplemental Undergraduate Application form, financial documentation, an adequate TOEFL score, proof of health insurance, and \$30 application fee.
- Re-entry** - If you previously attended PNC or another Purdue campus as a regularly admitted student, submit this application and official transcripts from any colleges attended since your last enrollment at Purdue.
- Permanent Regional Campus Transfer from Purdue** - If you are currently attending another Purdue campus and want to transfer permanently to PNC, submit this application.
- Temporary Regional Campus Transfer from Purdue** - If you are currently attending another Purdue campus and want to take classes temporarily at PNC, submit this application.
- Non-Degree With College Course Work or "Guest"** - If you are planning to take a few courses for credit, but do not intend to pursue a degree, submit this application. You may enroll temporarily at PNC for up to 18 credit hours.
