

**ARTICULATION AGREEMENT**  
**for Bachelor of Science in Education - Secondary**  
**Between Purdue University North Central and Ivy Tech Community College**

**Statement of Intent**

The purpose of this articulation agreement is to provide a mechanism whereby individuals graduating with the degree of Associate of Science (A.S.) in Education - Secondary are eligible to complete the requirements for the B.S. degree in Education at Purdue University North Central (PNC). Such eligibility is subject to the conditions detailed below and in attachments to this agreement.

**Principles upon which articulation is based**

1. The articulation initiatives are consistent with the Commission for Higher Education's State Policy on Associate Degree Programs offered at public institutions in Indiana.
2. Relationships between Ivy Tech Community College and Purdue University North Central faculty and administration have been and will continue to be in a spirit of cooperation that provides the basis for all articulation initiatives.
3. Graduates of the Ivy Tech Community College A.S. degree program in Education - Secondary who are accepted into the Purdue University North Central Department of Education and who successfully meet all requirements for a B.S. degree in Education will be awarded the Bachelor of Science Degree.
4. All students of Ivy Tech Community College applying for admission to the PNC Department of Education must meet all standards of Purdue University North Central.
5. Recognizing that changes in curricula and course content are inevitable, each institution agrees to discuss with the other institution all curriculum changes affecting this agreement before the changes are implemented.

**Specifics of Articulated Programs**

1. *Associate of Science Degree in Education - Secondary*  
Ivy Tech Community College will offer an Associate of Science (A.S.) Degree in Education - Secondary.

The A.S. Degree is designed as a transfer degree for students wishing to complete a baccalaureate degree at PNC following completion of the A.S. Degree and the Degree consists entirely of course work transferable to PNC.

2. *Curriculum and Program Articulation*  
In order to articulate the A.S. degree program and the Purdue University North Central B.S. program, all courses which are offered in the A.S. degree program must be the equivalent of specific courses which form the lower division course work for the B.S. degree. The program articulation is found in Exhibit I.
3. *Course Transfer and Grandfathering*  
Ivy Tech Community College students who have not completed the A.S. degree and who seek to transfer course credit which has been earned after the implementation of this agreement into the PNC Department of Education will have their transfer request evaluated on a course-by-course basis consistent with the prescribed policies and practices of Purdue University North Central.
4. *Means of Course Transfer*

All students transferring course credit from Ivy Tech Community College to PNC, whether following completion of the A.S. degree or for individual courses, will do so via official transcripts.

5. *Program Review*

The PNC Department of Education reserves the right to review periodically the Ivy Tech Community College A.S. program in Education – Secondary.

A review of the articulation agreement will commence after the second full year with revisions made as needed, and every three years hence.

**EFFECTIVE DATE, AMENDMENT, AND TERMINATION**

Terms of this Articulation Agreement will be effective beginning fall 2009. Ivy Tech Community College courses taken prior to that semester are not eligible for consideration for transfer to PNC unless covered by a specific prior agreement.

Each institution will inform the other, through its chief academic officer, of any institutional plans or changes that have impact upon the points of this Articulation prior to implementing those plans or changes. Proposed amendments will take effect only when approved by the Purdue University North Central Chancellor and the Ivy Tech Community College President.

Written notice of intention to terminate or withdraw from this Articulation Agreement will be submitted by the Chief Executive Officer of either institution not less than one calendar year prior to the proposed date of termination/withdrawal.
