Meeting Minutes February 26, 2009

**I. Call to Order**

Someone mentioned a PNC fireworks display that is being planned for August and that this would be a prime opportunity to coordinate an event in this time slot.

Heather Martino will research the chicken "port-a-pit" idea further and provide details at our next meeting.

A flea market or summertime sale in the PNC parking lot or at the Porter County Complex was also mentioned.

b) Public Service Activities – More involvement in public service activities was suggested. Some ideas included donating time to soup kitchens, or homeless shelters, and setting up areas outside of food markets to solicit food donations for local food pantries.

The current spring project of volunteering services during therapeutic horseback riding activities for the disabled was mentioned, but the date for this activity (in May) was not known.
