

Michigan Scholarship

The Michigan Scholarship is intended to increase diversity in the PNC student body. The award is available to students who are classified as Michigan residents living in Berrien, Cass and St. Joseph counties. Students receiving the awards may attend PNC at in-state costs for tuition and fees.

Criteria: Recipients must be beginning PNC students who:

(a) have a high school average of 80% or higher in their academic course work and earn an ACT score of at least 20 (or an SAT score of at least 1400), or

(b) transfer from another regionally accredited college or university with at least 12 credits and a cumulative GPA of at least 2.5, or

(c) transfer from another regionally accredited college or university having completed 12 credit hours at more than one college with a cumulative GPA of 2.5. Transfer students with fewer than 12 credits completed will be evaluated on their high school record and test scores.

No scholarship application is required. This award may be used for summer school. A cumulative GPA of 2.5 is required for renewal. Grades for renewal are checked at the end of the fall and spring semesters each year. Awards are limited to four years of enrollment for full time students (students are not required to enroll in summer). Part-time students are limited to six years of enrollment (students are not required to enroll in summer). A student may receive a Merit Scholarship, or a Chancellor's Leadership Award, along with the Michigan Scholarship if qualified. Not available to other students currently or previously enrolled at PNC. Award may commence in fall or spring semester.
