

Academic Probation

Summary of Policies and Regulations

What is Academic Probation?

At the close of each semester in which you are a full-time student, your record will be reviewed to verify your grade point average (GPA). The University accumulative GPA standard for good academic standing for all students is based on the Semester and Graduation Index. If students within that semester fall below the minimum GPA, then they are placed on Scholastic Probation.

Scholastic Probation

A student shall be placed on probation if the student's semester or graduation index at the end of any regular semester is less than that required for a student with a classification as shown in Table A below.

A student on probation shall be removed from that status at the end of the first subsequent semester in which the student achieves semester and graduate indexes equal to or greater than those required for a student with a classification as shown in Table A below.

Any grade change due to reporting error will result in a recalculation of the index and determination of probation status.

Index Levels for Probation

Semester 8 and up	1.7 GPA

Graduation Index (Table B)	
Semester 0 and 1	1.5 GPA
Semester 2	1.6 GPA
Semester 3	1.7 GPA
Semester 4	1.8 GPA
Semester 5	1.9 GPA
Semester 6 and up	2.0 GPA

Continued on Probation

If you are already on probation, you may be allowed to continue at PNC until the next review if you are making adequate progress toward attaining required Semester and Graduation Index GPA.

Removed from Probation

Removal from probation is automatic when your accumulative GPA reaches the required Semester and Graduation Index or above.

Dropping of Students for Scholastic Deficiency

A student on scholastic probation shall be dropped from the University if at the close of any semester in which the student's graduation index is less than that required in Table B or if the student receives six credit hours or more of failing F, WF grades for the semester. This rule shall not apply for the semester in which the student completes all requirements for a degree. A student dropped by this rule and later duly readmitted as a regular student shall be readmitted on probation.

Semester 5	1.7 GPA
Semester 6	1.8 GPA
Semester 7	1.9 GPA
Semester 8 and up	2.0 GPA

Readmission

Applications for readmission to the University from students who have been dropped for academic reasons must be accompanied by a check or money order, not cash, for \$100 made payable to Purdue University. Processing of the application will not begin until the fee is paid. Applications may be obtained from the Registrar's Office.

College Standards for Performance

You should be aware that some programs in the University maintain higher than the Semester and Graduation Index standards of performance for continuance and graduation in the major.
