



Experience & Experiment (semester 3)

Now is the time to test out the waters. Once you have found a major that you believe will fit you, it's time to experience it. *Keep in mind that one major can lead to a diversity of careers, and that it is okay to change your mind as you learn more about the choices available to you.* **Make sure to visit with an academic advisor to officially declare your major!**

Find an Internship

An internship is a major/career related work experience where you take on responsible roles as workers. Internships usually last one semester and are available in most major/career areas. They are structured, supervised work experiences that can be paid or unpaid and may be eligible for college credit.

Volunteer

Volunteering is another option for students to gain practical and/or career-related experience. These experiences may help to develop leadership and people skills. It will also cultivate an understanding of citizenship and community beyond the campus.

Participate in a research project

Seek out a faculty member who is conducting research that is of interest to you.

Consider Graduate School

Is graduate school right for you?

Consider a Double Major, Minor, or a certificate program

Check with an academic advisor, to make sure you will still be able to finish your program in four years.
